

Henrico Retired School Personnel Association Minutes  
June 16, 2004

After the social time, President Dianne Hughs Shuler called the meeting to order at 11:45 a.m. After welcoming all to The Cultural Arts Center at Glen Allen, she advised that there would be a change in the order of the proceedings. The guest speaker, Dr. Dennis Morey, would speak directly after lunch and the business portion of our meeting would be conducted after his presentation.

After the luncheon, Dr. Dennis Morey, Chairman of the Historical Research for the Henricus Foundation, gave us all quite a history lesson on the settlements of Jamestown and Henricus.

The first order of business was the installation of the new officers by Vice President LuVellen Spratley. Those sworn into office were: Dianne Hughs Shuler, President; Rose U. Tanner, Secretary; and Becky Goshorn, Treasurer. After the installation, Dale Waldrop's years of service as Treasurer were recognized with a vase of flowers.

The minutes of the March 16, 2004 meeting were approved as presented.

The end-of-year membership for HRSPA is 579, District C – 87, and VRTA – 157.

Becky Goshorn, Treasurer reported a year-end balance of \$4189.27 for HRSPA and \$1991.00 in the Scholarship Fund.

Hospitality committee reported attendance at the luncheons for the year 358 with 100+ at this meeting.

The Social Committee was recognized and thanked for the door prizes and the candy at the back tables.

The total amount for printing the newsletter for the year was \$719.47 and the mailing for the year was \$952.09.

Joanne McCabe, Chairman of the Scholarship Committee, recognized her committee members and thanked them for their help with the scholarship fund. She reported that 15 applications were received and reviewed by the committee. The recipient for this year is

Memorial donations have amounted to \$656 for this year that will go towards the Scholarship Fund. We received \$9255 in Ukrops Golden Gift Certificates which should net us about \$177 for the Scholarship Fund.

Legislative Chairman, Nelson Taylor, gave an abbreviated report, focusing mainly on the age 62-65 deduction. This will be phased out in three years. His report is attached to the minutes and was available for all to review.

Insurance Agent, Bruce Adee, was available after the meeting for questions concerning long-term health care and tax sheltered annuities.

President Shuler asked that the volunteer forms on the tables be filled out and put in the red wagon on the table in the back. She also invited everyone to peruse/take the brochures displayed on the table in the back.

Everyone was asked to look over the dates for the upcoming meetings and to please mark their calendars. The speaker for the October meeting will be Dr. Charles Sydnor, President of WCVE TV, Community Ideas Station.

It was reported that special invitational letters have been sent to all former employees of transportation, food service, and adult ed in an effort to remind them that HRSP is for them too and that C&M will be the focus in the fall.

Social Chair, Mary Shepherd and her husband Bill were congratulated on their 60<sup>th</sup> wedding anniversary.

Vice-President LuVellen Spratley thanked the school contacts for their hard work. If anyone is interested in becoming a school contact please let her know. There will be a meeting of all contacts in July.

Joanne McCabe informed us that the scholarship recipient for 2003 earned straight A's at Reynolds this year.
